Project Overview

Description – The primary purpose of this project is to improve safety and traffic operations at the intersection.

The project will reconstruct Huguenot Trail (Rt. 711) 0.3 mile west of Rt. 288 and realign and combine Huguenot Springs Road (Rt. 607) and Woolridge Road (Rt. 721) to form a new intersection with Huguenot Trail. The project design will also add a westbound left turn lane on Huguenot Trail to the newly aligned Huguenot Springs Road.

Total: \$3.6 million

Engineering: \$500,000

Right of Way: \$1.4 million

Construction: \$1.7 million

Anticipated Schedule –

Design approval - Fall 2018

Begin right of way acquisition - Fall 2019

Begin construction - Spring 2022
