## **ALL WESTBOUND LANES TO CLOSE ON ARMISTEAD AVENUE**

*All westbound lanes will be closed at the I-64 overpass for up to 6 weeks to allow for interstate bridge rehabilitation work*

**HAMPTON**—Starting Wednesday, April 24, all westbound lanes on Armistead Avenue between YMCA Way and the I-64 off-ramp before Thomas Street will be closed as emergency repair work continues on the I-64 overpass bridge. To ensure the safety of motorists traveling beneath the bridge, this full directional closure of Armistead Avenue will be up in place lasting up to 6 weeks. Signed detours using Pembroke Avenue and LaSalle Avenue will be in place. As of Tuesday, April 23, the eastbound lanes on Armistead Avenue have reopened to traffic.

Due to the demolition of bridge deck required for beam removal and replacement, the LaSalle Avenue on-ramp and auxiliary lane on I-64 east will remain closed with a signed detour in place for the duration of the repairs. The three main eastbound travel lanes on I-64 will remain open to traffic throughout the project.

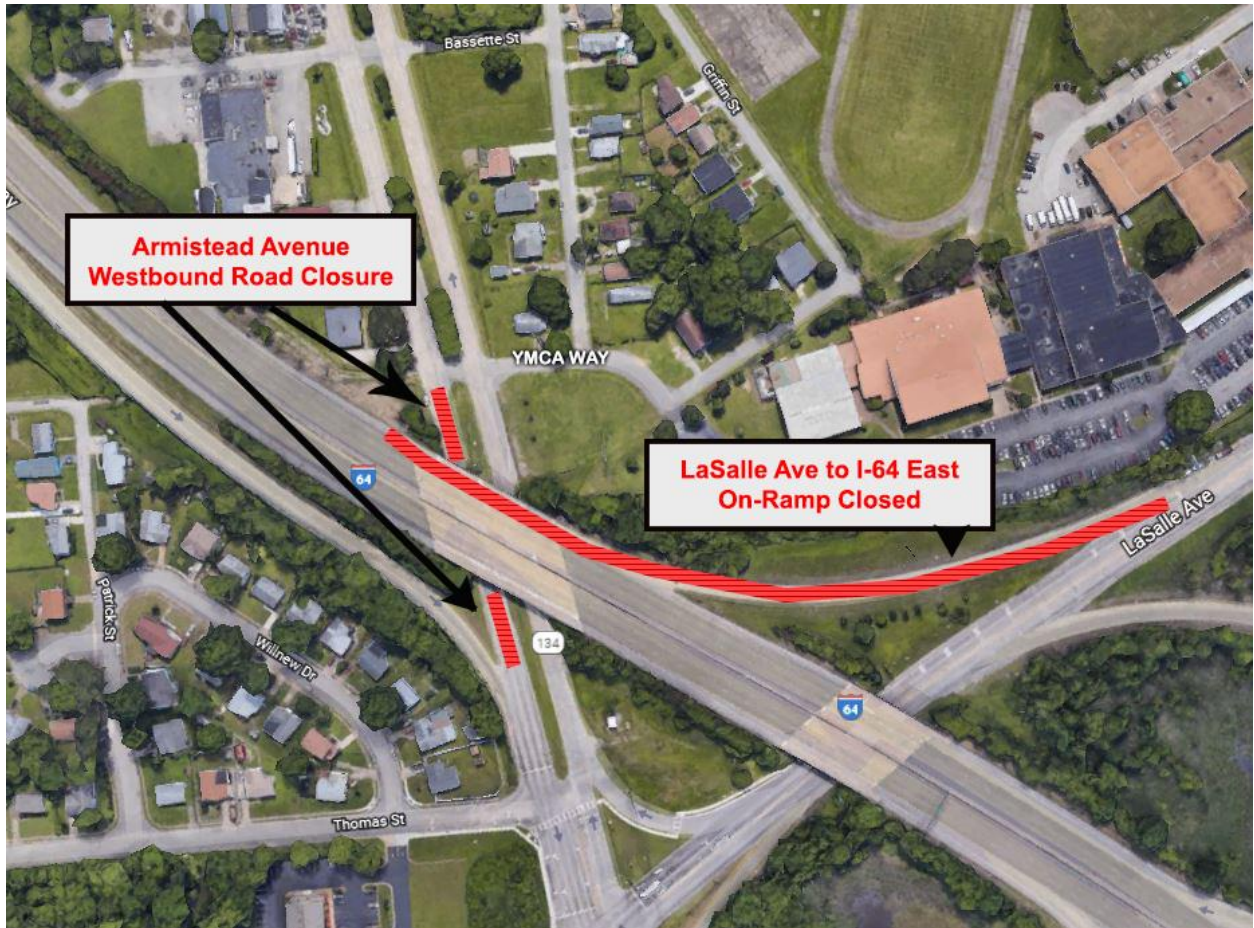
Weather permitting, all repair work is estimated to be complete this summer.

VDOT awarded the \$1.4 million contract to Curtis Contracting, with an estimated completion of summer 2019. All work is weather permitting.
