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HAMPTON ROADS AREA LANE CLOSURE FORECAST

For the week of November 1 through November 7

Hampton Roads, Va. - In an effort to keep you informed, VDOT publishes the following scheduled highway lane closures that may affect traffic in Hampton Roads. These closures are subject to change due to weather conditions and other unforeseen events. Other closures may occur which do not appear on this report.

YORK COUNTY

I-64 East – Motorists should expect a single lane closure between Route 199 (Exit 242) and Route 143 (Exit 247) for tree trimming operations, Monday, October 2, through Friday, November 6, from 9 p.m. to 4 a.m.

JAMES CITY COUNTY

Route 60 East/West – Motorists should expect alternating lane closures from the Route 60/Route 30/Route 143 Intersection (Anderson's Corner) to Route 620 west bound, and from the New Kent County line to Route 657 (Ivy Hill Road) east bound for concrete pavement repair, Monday, November 2, through Friday, November 6, from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. The project is expected to last through November 2009.

HAMPTON/NORFOLK/VIRGINIA BEACH/CHESAPEAKE

I-64 East/West – Motorists should expect mobile, alternating lane closures from Mallory Street (Exit 268) to the Bowers Hill Interchange (Exit 299) for pothole repair, Wednesday, November 4, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

HAMPTON/NEWPORT NEWS

I-664 North/South – Motorists should expect mobile lane closures from the I-64 Interchange (Exit 1) to Terminal Avenue (Exit 7) for drain cleaning operations, Monday, November 2, through Friday, November 6, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

NEWPORT NEWS

I-664 North – Motorists should expect multiple lane closures from Chestnut Avenue (Exit 4) to Powhatan Parkway (Exit 2) for pavement repair, Sunday, November 1, through Friday, November 6, from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m.

I-664 South – Motorists should expect single lane closures from Aberdeen Road (Exit 3) to Roanoke Avenue (Exit 4) for pavement repair, Sunday, November 1, through Friday, November 6, from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m.

Jefferson Avenue Widening Project

Route 143 North/South – Through March 2010, motorists should expect alternating lane closures and traffic shifts on Jefferson Avenue from Buchanan Drive to King's Ridge for construction activity, Monday through Friday, from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Motorists should expect a new traffic pattern for the duration of the project. The work zone is now between both directions of travel lanes, eliminating left turn lanes, except those allowable at intersections.

Warwick Boulevard East/West Route 60 – Motorists should expect multiple alternating lane closures for construction activities on Warwick Boulevard from Nettles Drive to J. Clyde Morris Boulevard, Monday through Friday. Anticipate overnight lane closures from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. on both east and west bound lanes. Daytime lane closures should be expected daily from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. on west bound lanes only. These lane closures will be in affect through project completion in December 2009.

- Motorists should expect a *complete* lane closure at Wellesley Drive for construction activities. Wellesley Drive will be closed through the end of November. Motorists should be alert for the detour onto Kenilworth Drive and Deep Creek Road.
- Motorists should expect *daytime* lane closures on Warwick Boulevard, both east and west bound, from 7 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. for the duration of the paving project. Business entrances could be impacted for short periods east bound from Middlesex Road/Hidenwood Drive to Hiden Boulevard and west bound from Nutmeg Quarter to Hiden Boulevard while paving machines move past the entrances.

JAMES RIVER BRIDGE

Route 17 South – Motorists should expect a single lane closure on the James River Bridge for bridge deck repairs, Sunday, November 1, through Thursday, November 5, from 6 p.m. to 5 a.m.

Route 17 North/South – Motorists should expect a single lane closure for gate, signal and roadway maintenance from River Road to Kings Cove Way, Tuesday, November 3, through Friday, November 6, from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

HAMPTON ROADS BRIDGE-TUNNEL

I-64 East – Motorist should expect overnight single lane closures Sunday through Thursday, from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. for the roadway lighting upgrade to the I-64 East Hampton Roads Bridge-Tunnel. Westbound traffic will not be affected and no weekend closures are planned. The project is scheduled for completion in spring 2011.

Motorists are encouraged to use I-664 Monitor Merrimac Memorial Bridge Tunnel to avoid delays. Take Exit 264 to access I-664. Use exit 15A for Norfolk and Virginia Beach destinations. DOWNTOWN TUNNEL

I-264 East/West – Motorists should expect mobile lane closures through the Downtown Tunnel, over the Berkley Bridge and at I-464 on and off ramps, for sweeping operations Wednesday, November 4, and Friday, November 6, from midnight. to 5 a.m.

I-264 East – Motorists should expect a single left lane closure through the Downtown Tunnel and across the Berkley Bridge for bridge house roof and electrical repairs, Saturday, November 7, and Sunday, November 8, from 5 a.m. to 9 p.m.

I-264 East/West – Motorists should expect single lane closures through the Downtown Tunnel for tunnel maintenance, Wednesday, November 4, and Thursday, November 5, from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m.

MIDTOWN TUNNEL

Route 58 East/West – Motorists should expect a single westbound lane closure Monday, November 2, and a single eastbound lane closure, Tuesday, November 3, through the Midtown Tunnel for lighting and drainage maintenance, each night from 9:30 p.m. to 5 a.m.

NORFOLK

Princess Anne Road Widening Project

Motorists should expect multiple lane closures and traffic shifts for paving operations between Cowand Street and Sigmon Street, Monday, November 2, through Friday, November 6, from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. Motorists will be directed and should be alert for flagging operations.

Virginia Beach Boulevard Widening Project

Route 58 East/West – Motorists should expect alternating lane closures between Military Highway and Jett Street for storm water and sewer pipe installation, Monday, November 2, through Friday, November 6, from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Hampton Boulevard Grading Project

Motorists should expect multiple alternating lane closures, both north and south bound on Hampton Boulevard between “B” Avenue and Greenbrier for utility operations, Monday, November 2, through Thursday, November 6, from 5 p.m. to 5 a.m.

Motorists should expect multiple alternating lane closures north bound between Rogers and Mapleshade Avenue for utility operations, Monday, November 2, through Thursday, November 6, from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

NORFOLK/VIRGINIA BEACH

I-264 East/West – Motorists should expect single lane closures from Waterside (Exit 9) to Lynnhaven Parkway (Exit 19) for sweeping and drain cleaning operations from Sunday, November 1, through Tuesday, November 3, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

I-64 East/West – Motorists should expect mobile lane closures from the High Rise Bridge to the I-264 Interchange for sweeping and drain cleaning operations, Tuesday, November 3, through Friday, November 6, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

VIRGINIA BEACH/NORFOLK/PORTSMOUTH

I-264 East/West – Motorists should expect mobile, alternating lane closures from Birdneck Road (Exit 22) in Virginia Beach, through Norfolk and to Victory Boulevard (Exit 3) in Portsmouth for pothole repair, Sunday, November 1, through Friday, November 6, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

PORTSMOUTH

I-264 East – Motorists should expect multiple lane closures at Frederick Boulevard (Exit 5) for corrective sign maintenance, Thursday, November 5, and Friday, November 6, from 9 p.m. to 3 a.m.

I-264 East/West – Motorists should expect mobile alternating lane closures from Greenwood Drive (Exit 2) through the I-464 Interchange (Exit 8) for drain cleaning, Sunday, November 1, through Friday, November 6, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

I-264 East – Motorists should expect shoulder closures from Des Moines Avenue (Exit 6) towards the Downtown Tunnel for guardrail improvements Monday, November 2, through Friday, November 6, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

I-264 East – Motorists should expect multiple lane closures from Bowers Hill Interchange (Exit 1) to the Downtown Tunnel for paving operations and guardrail repair. This long term paving project will continue through November 2009. Crews will set up a single lane closure, Monday through Friday, from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. throughout the term of the project.

CHESAPEAKE

I-64 East/West Restorative Pavement Project – Motorists should expect alternating lane closures from the Bowers Hill Interchange to the I-464 Interchange, Monday through Thursday, from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m., for restorative pavement maintenance work.

Work will include patching isolated concrete pavement, increasing the width of the inside shoulder and replacing two lifts of asphalt. These paving operations will continue through August 2011.

VIRGINIA BEACH

Lynnhaven Parkway North/South – Motorists should expect alternating lane closures on Lynnhaven Parkway between Holland Road and Lishelle Place for curb installations, Monday, November 2, through Friday, November 6, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

SUFFOLK

Route 164 Western Freeway – Motorists should expect alternating lane closures between College Drive and the I-664 Interchange for bridge safety inspection, Thursday, November 5, from 9 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

I-664 South – Motorists should expect an off-ramp closure at Route 17 North/Bridge Road (Exit 9) for roadway construction through November 25, 2009, from 9 a.m. to noon. Motorists will be diverted to College Drive (Exit 8).

Route 17 North/South – Motorists should expect a traffic shift between I-664 and College Drive for roadway construction. Motorists will be diverted onto the new bridge while the southbound lanes and I-664 ramps are constructed. Motorists should expect two-way traffic on the bridge through the duration of the project, which is expected to be complete in November 2009.

SUSSEX

Route 35 North/South – Motorists should expect alternating lane closures from Route 622 to Route 626 for pavement repair Monday, November 2, and Wednesday, November 3, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

FRANKLIN

US Route 58 Business East/West – Motorists should be alert to a traffic shift rerouting motorists to the new bridge. Motorists should expect the one eastbound and one westbound lane to remain in place while the remaining two lanes are under construction. The bridge is expected to be complete in November 2009.

CHINCOTEAGUE ISLAND/ACCOMAC

Route 175 East/West – Motorists should expect the causeway at the West end of the Black Narrows Bridge to be open to alternating one-way traffic controlled by a traffic light starting Sept. 14 and continuing until the end of the year. Motorists should also expect periodic lane closures throughout the duration of the project, Monday through Saturday, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

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
