Update on storm damage repair *Five roads reopened; eight remain closed*

SOUTH CHESTERFIELD – The Virginia Department of Transportation has reopened five roads that were damaged by flooding during the May 19-20 storms. However, eight roads remain closed. Below is an update on repairs:

Brunswick County

- Robinson Ferry Road (Route 644) near Rt. 58 – Bridge closed due to excessive debris; Environmental process underway. No timeline for reopening

Hanover County

- Kings Dominion Boulevard (Route 30) west near Doswell Road – Road remains closed due to washout; all eastbound and westbound traffic is moving in the eastbound lanes. Work is underway and repairs are expected to be complete by mid-August.
- W. Patrick Henry Road (Route 54) near Independence Road – Road remains closed due to washout; use posted detour. Repair plans are under development. Tentative completion date is late summer.
- Horseshoe Bridge Road (Route 686) near Stagg Creek – Road closed for bridge repair; use posted detour. Work is underway and repairs are expected to be complete in late June.

Lunenburg County

- Switchback Road (Route 605) between S. Hill Road and Jonesboro Road – Road closed due to washout; use posted detour. Repair plan in place to install a concrete box culvert. Repairs are expected to be complete by mid-July.

- Saffold Road (Route 635) near the Mecklenburg County line – Road closed for bridge repair; use posted detour. Repair plan in place and work is expected to be complete by mid-July.

Mecklenburg County

- Chalk Level Road (Route 655) near Route 47 – Road closed due to washout; use posted detour. Repair plan in place to replace two pipes and work is expected to be complete by mid-July.

Prince George County

- Alden Road (Route 624) near the Sussex County line – Road closed due to washout; use posted detour. Repair plan in place to replace a pipe and work is expected to be complete by mid-July.

Repair work is weather dependent. As a reminder, motorists should not drive around or move barricades or signage.
