Largest Hauling Contracts in VDOT History Awarded to DBEs

Two hauling contracts, the largest in VDOT history, were recently awarded to DBE firms for projects in Northern Virginia and the Hampton Roads District. The largest contract (\$3 million) was awarded to a DBE team consisting of K&M Enterprises, Devon Contracting, Inc. and Fairchild Trucking, Inc., located in Fredericksburg on the Interstate-495 HOT Lanes Project, which is the largest construction project currently underway in America. Don't Stop Trucking, Inc., located in Portsmouth, received a contract valued at \$980,000 for the VDOT Hampton Boulevard Grade Separation Project (Route 337), that will include two new bridges and provide improved roadway lighting, signals, drainage, landscaping, bike lanes, curbs, gutters and sidewalks. Don't Stop Trucking, Inc. was established in July 2005 with one dump truck and 20 years experience in the trucking industry. Stacy and Kim Dobbins, owners of Don't Stop Trucking, LLC. are very excited that networking has paid off. Stanford Moore of K&M Enterprises formerly chaired the VDOT Transportation DBE Advisory Committee, and is a recent graduate of the BOWD Center.

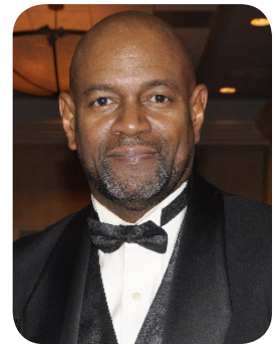

ENTERS THE VDOT BUSINESS OPPORTUNITY AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

The BOWD Program recently welcomed 12 DBE firms for targeted business development and supportive service assistance to become more competitive in bidding, estimating and ultimately securing contracts. The BOWD program was piloted by the FHWA in 2007 to promote increased participation of DBEs on federally assisted highway contracts. In August, 19 out of 22 firms DBE firms completed a two year commitment with the BOWD program. Twenty-two DBE firms completed business plans as an important management tool, and two DBE firms pursued diversification through milling and concrete recycling.

BOWD services are available to DBEs certified and located in the state of Virginia. Targeted one-on-one assistance is offered in areas including:

- ▶ **Bond packaging**
- ▶ **Computerized accounting and finances**
- ▶ **Job cost accounting systems**
- ▶ **Estimating, bidding and proposal preparation**
- ▶ **Construction management and technical assistance**

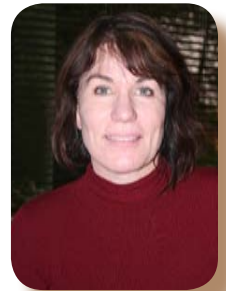

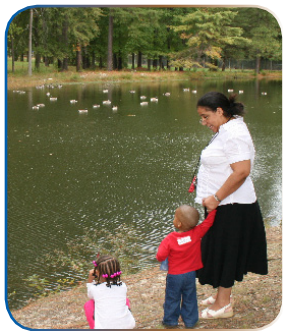

INFRASTRUCTURE AND JOBS INVESTMENT

The Jobs for Main Street Act of 2010 is a bill that targets \$75 billion investments to create or save jobs in key areas of economic growth such as highways and transit, school renovation, hiring teachers, police, and firefighters, small business, job training and affordable housing.

Recently, the US House of Representatives voted to pass an amended version of the Senate-passed jobs package (H.R. 2847). The House amendments would direct some transportation funding to minority-owned businesses and address deficit concerns. Otherwise, the bill includes payroll tax relief for businesses that hire new workers, makes permanent the Build America Bonds program to fund state and local infrastructure projects, an extension of expense deductions for small businesses and an extension of the Highway Trust Fund through December 31, 2010 with an infusion of nearly \$20 billion. The bill will return to the Senate for consideration.

Center for Public Integrity Report

The Center for Public Integrity recently issued a report about transportation influences revealing that at least 1800 interest groups, lobbied the U.S. Congress in the first half of 2009. The list of entities financially contributing to the influence of transportation business includes:

- More than 475 U.S. cities and 160 counties in 44 states;
- More than 55 local development authorities nationwide;
- At least 65 private real estate development companies;
- At least 95 transit agencies, 25 metro and regional planning organizations, a dozen individual states, and the national lobbying associations for all three groups;
- More than 75 road and auto organizations, from highway builders and car manufacturers to interstate coalitions and trucking interests;
- At least 65 construction and engineering groups, from cement and steel makers to domestic and foreign-owned builders;
- More than 45 rail organizations, 50 shipping companies and ports, and 45 additional transportation-centric outfits, from bicycle coalitions to research groups;
- More than 140 universities seeking funds for local projects or campus research centers.

DOL Compliance Training

VDOT recently partnered with the U.S. Department of Labor to host technical assistance seminars for construction contractors and subcontractors with federal or federally assisted contracts.

The purpose of the seminars were to increase contractor awareness of the Office of Federal Contract Compliance Program. Regional seminars addressed recordkeeping, monitoring compensation practices, sixteen affirmative action steps and recruitment goals required of contractors to demonstrate compliance, plus strategies for maintaining personnel activity data.

TAX WORKSHOP FOR DBES

The BOWD Center recently hosted a Small Business Tax Workshop for certified DBEs to help owners understand and fulfill federal tax responsibilities. Presenter Ley Mills, Senior Tax Specialist, guided participants through the Internal Revenue Service Web site to locate forms and publications about a variety of topics and provided useful insight for proper recordkeeping (such as the need to keep business records for at least four years). He also highlighted information related to allowable business expenses (Publication 463, Page 26 has a chart for proving expenses related travel, entertainment, gifts and transportation) tax credits and updates related to the American Recovery & Reinvestment Act of 2009.
