OF  
MEETING OF STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION OF VIRGINIA  
RICHMOND, VIRGINIA  
JUNE 27, 1963**

The State Highway Commission of Virginia met in the Commission Room of the New Highway Building in Richmond, Virginia, on June 27, 1963, at 10:00 A.M. Deputy Commissioner F. A. Davis presided.

The decision of the Chief Engineer shall be binding on  
all parties.

A Contractor, having been disqualified in accordance  
with the above, may be reinstated only by petition to any  
approval by the State Highway Commission.

WHEREAS, 6.47 miles of road within the Seashore State  
Park have heretofore been maintained as a part of the Princess Anne  
Secondary System; and

WHEREAS, this road mileage within the Seashore State  
Park qualifies under the provision of Section 33-24 of the Code of

On motion of Mr. Chilton, seconded by Judge Weaver, the Commission voted to deny the request of the Town Council of Chase City that the bridge over the Southern Railway at Chase City be named the "Robert E. Lee Bridge." There is now a bridge in the City of Richmond named the Lee Bridge. Also, the Commission felt that such naming should be reserved for a possible future major structure befitting the title.

On motion of Mr. Chilton, seconded by Mr. Holland, the Commission authorized a study by the Traffic Engineers named in the Trust Indenture on the Toll Revenue Bond Facilities as to a possible revision of toll rates on the bond facilities.

The inclusion of the name of Mr. George D. Felix on the plaque placed in the Broad Street lobby of the new Highway Building was discussed. Mr. Mattox reported that at the time the matter was first considered the plaque had been fabricated and that the inclusion of another name would necessitate recasting, at a cost of approximately \$300. Mr. Mattox also stated that a plaque in memory of Mr. Felix would be placed in the corridor of the Right of Way Division. On motion of Mr. Flythe, seconded by Mr. Holland, the Commission voted that the plaque not be changed.

Due to the illness of Commissioner Harris the June meeting was held at Richmond instead of Virginia Beach as had been planned and a meeting of the Commission at Virginia Beach was tentatively scheduled for July 18.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:55 A.M.
