The monthly meeting of the Commonwealth Transportation Board was held at the Sheraton Inn Fredericksburg in Fredericksburg, Virginia, on July 18, 1996, at 10:00 a.m. The Chairman, Dr. Robert E. Martinez, presided.

Governor George Allen made the following appointments to the Board effective July 1, 1996:

On motion of Mr. Porter, seconded by Mr. Newcomb, the Board approved Permits Issued and Canceled from June 1, 1996, through June 30, 1996, inclusive.

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board is authorized under Section 33.1-41.1 of the Code of Virginia, as amended to approve payments to cities and certain towns for street maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, certain Principal-Minor Arterial Roads, Collector Roads and Local Streets within the corporate limits of the Town of Blacksburg are eligible for such payment; and

WHEREAS, under the authority of Section 33.1-41.1, request is made by the Town of Blacksburg for maintenance payments on Minor Arterial Roads and Local Streets meeting the required criteria.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the road/street mileage eligible for quarterly payments to the Town of Blacksburg for Minor Arterial Roads and Local Streets be increased by 0.98 centerline mile. This increase is a result of additions of Minor Arterial Roads and Local Streets as described on tabulation sheet numbered 1 through 1 for the Town of Blacksburg as functionally classified by the Transportation Planning Division dated June 9, 1996.

The Local Street additions totaling 2.06 miles increases the total mileage to 101.45 centerline miles of approved streets subject to maintenance payments effective for payment beginning July 1, 1996.

WHEREAS, under Project 0083-097-101, RW201, a portion of Route 83 (present Route 851) was relocated, and the new location serves the same citizens as the old road; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 33.1-155 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, a section of present Route 851 was abandoned by the Board of Supervisors of Wise County by resolution dated July 14, 1994; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner has certified in writing that a portion of the lands containing 1.98 acres, more or less, and lying north of and adjacent to the north existing/proposed right of way of Route 83, from a point approximately 110 feet opposite approximate Station 432+80 (Route 83 centerline) to a point approximately 280 feet opposite approximate Station 437+20 (Route 83 centerline), does not constitute a section of the public road and is deemed by him no longer necessary for the uses of the Secondary System of State Highways; and

WHEREAS, the adjacent landowner has requested that a portion of the right of way be conveyed to him.

NOW, THEREFORE, in accordance with the provisions of Section 33.1-154 of the Code of Virginia (1950), as amended, the conveyance of said lands, so certified, is hereby approved and the Commonwealth Transportation Commissioner is authorized to execute a deed without warranty, in the name of the Commonwealth conveying same to the adjacent landowner of record for a consideration satisfactory to the State Right of Way Engineer, subject to such restrictions as may be deemed appropriate.

WHEREAS, it appears that these items of work fall within the intent of Section 33.1-75.1 of the Code of Virginia, and comply with the guidelines of the Department for use of such funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Commonwealth Transportation Board hereby approves the allocation of these funds as set forth in "Attachment A."

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Transportation Board has endorsed the legislative proposal developed by the STEP 21 Commonwealth Transportation Board has endorsed the legislative proposal developed by the

WHEREAS, this legislation embodies the principles put forth by the STEP 21 Coalition; and

WHEREAS, the "ISTEA Integrity Restoration Act" would bring greater fairness, flexibility and simplicity to the funding of the federal highway program; and

WHEREAS, the proposed legislation funds the National Highway System as the key federal responsibility; and

WHEREAS, it simplifies and makes more flexible the federal highway program; and

WHEREAS, it updates the antiquated federal funding distribution formulae; and

WHEREAS, it equitably balances the amount of federal gas tax dollars collected from each state with the amount of funding each state receives back from the federal Highway Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, under this legislation Virginia's share of federal highway program funds would increase approximately 14 percent, resulting in an additional \$60 million to address transportation needs of Virginians.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Commonwealth Transportation Board, on this eighteenth day of July, 1996:

That the Congress of the United States should enact, prior to the expiration of ISTEA, the "ISTEA Integrity Restoration Act" introduced by Representatives Delay and Condit.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be dispatched to the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee, and Virginia's members of the United States Senate and the United States House of Representatives.
