Minutes of the Meeting of the State Highways  
Commission of Virginia, Held in  
Richmond, October 23, 1941

The State Highway Commission, consisting of Messrs. J. A. Anderson, S. W. Rawls, Secretary, Kenneth E. Gilpin, Howard C. Rogers and Lee Long, met in their office, Central Highway Office Building, Richmond, Virginia, at 9:00 o'clock on Thursday, October 23, 1941.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Gilpin, that the minutes of the September 25th meeting be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Gilpin, that the Commission allot to the City of Winchester for 1941-42 the \$500.00 per mile construction funds to be expended for the continued widening, building curb and gutter and paving on Route 522 in the city. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Gilpin, that the Commission allot to the City of Pulaski the \$500. per mile construction funds for the year 1941-42 to be expended on Route 99 in the Town, and that an extension of time in the expenditure of the 1940-1941 allotment be approved, due to labor conditions. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Gilpin, that the Commission approve the permits issued from September 25th to October 23rd inclusive, as recorded in the Auditing Division. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Gilpin, that on the request of the Town Council of Front Royal to apply Route U. S. 340 to Route 12 from Berryville-South to its intersection with Route 11 south of Staunton, the Chairman be authorized to make a study of this matter and report back at the next meeting. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that as provided by Chapter 237, Act approved March 27, 1940, and upon recommendation of the Commissioner, the following sections of Route 738 in Carroll County being no longer necessary for use as a highway the same be abandoned upon opening of new sections in lieu thereof: Sections 1, 2 and 3 as shown on plat dated September 23, 1941, Project 1257 A. That sections 4, 5 and 6 also shown on the plat referred to be added to the system in lieu of abandoned sections, under Chapter 415, Acts of 1932. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that as provided by Chapter 415, Section 8, Act approved March 31, 1932, and upon recommendation of the Commissioner, due to the construction of Project 1153 DEL, B2, the following section of road in Buchanan County being a necessary addition as a connection between Routes 645 and 4 it be added to the secondary systems Section 1 as shown on plat dated September 9, 1941. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Gilpin, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project FAGS 1368-FB2, Route 608, Relocation Routes 608 and 662 near Cold Spring Station, to the low bidder, R. W. Moore, Staunton, Va., at his bid of \$22,868.40; that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$25,100.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilpin, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 746 F31, Q31, Route 60, Intersection Route 15- Powhatan-Cumberland County Line, to the low bidder, Sam Finley, Inc., Roanoke, Va., at their bid of \$220,845.62; that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$385.60 for Landscaping, making a total of approximately \$243,300.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilpin, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 1161-B8, B9, Route 12, bridges over Faine and Meadow Hums, to the low bidder, Pocahontas Construction Co. Inc., Lewisburg, W. Va., at their bid of \$26,853.63; that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$29,500.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Gilpin, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 471 BW1, Route 1, 1.1 Mi. S. Roanoke River - North Carolina State Line, to the low bidder, R. K. Williams, 104 Hillcrest Ave., W., Richmond, Virginia, at his bid of \$101,290.27; and that additional amount of \$3,699.73 be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$110.00 for Landscaping, making a total of approximately \$110,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilpin, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 611-AB2, Route 58, 3.9 Mi. W. of WCL Clarksville - 1.7 Mi. W. of WCL Clarksville, to the low bidder, G. P. Clay, Box 481, Richmond, Va. at his bid of \$61,192.62; that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, and \$25.50 for Landscaping, making a total of approximately \$68,500.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilpin, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 631 G2,3, Route 11, 0.9 Mi. S. South End Buffalo Creek Bridge - 3.5 Mi. N. Natural Bridge (Fancy Hill), to the low bidder, Echols Bros. Inc., Staunton, Va., at their bid of \$130,015.71; that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$8.00 for landscaping, making a total of approximately \$143,000.00 chargeable to this project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Gilpin, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 122 AR2,B2, Route 58, 0.2 Mi. W. of W. C. L. Jonesville - 0.9 Mi. W. of W. C. L. Jonesville, to the low bidder, C. D. and C. P. Fugate, Wise, Va., at their bid of \$38,889.72; and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$42,800.00 chargeable to this project; the additional \$2,800.00 required over the available allocation to be taken from the reserve set up for this purpose. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilpin, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 571 OH1,B1,R1, Route 58, 3.4 Mi. W. Greenville County Line - 2.5 Mi. E. Edgerton, to the low bidder, Bowers Construction Company (Corp.) Raleigh, N. C., at their bid of \$37,715.49; that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$124.50 for Landscaping, making a total of approximately \$41,600.00 chargeable to this project; the \$1500 necessary to finance this project to be taken from the 1941 State Funds on the same Route and Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Gilpin, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 1087 M1,2, Routes 195 and 88, Streets of Branchville, to the low bidder, Laramore Construction Company, Danville, Va., at their bid of \$10,108.05; and that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work, making a total of approximately \$13,300 chargeable to this project; provided contractor will accept extension of this contract for approximately 500 feet on Route 195 at the same unit prices as set up in the bid, increasing the contract approximately \$2,000, a total, including 10%, of \$2,300.00. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilpin, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission confirm award of contract for the construction of Project S 188-DW1, S 247-#4 B1,2,3,4,W1, Route 360, 0.1 Mi. E. Mechanicsville - 3.1 Mi. E. of E. C. L. Richmond, to the low bidder, Hechler Brothers, Highland Springs, Va., at their bid of \$114,770.09; that 10% additional be set aside to cover the cost of engineering and additional work and \$38.00 for Landscaping, making a total of approximately \$126,300.00 chargeable to this project; the additional funds required to finance this project to be transferred from the 1941 State Funds on the same Route and Project. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Gilpin, that permit No. 1135, Route 122, Bedford County, issued July 6, 1941 to Mr. G. O. Noell, Route 1, Bedford, Va., be cancelled as recommended by the District Engineer. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Gilpin, that permit No. 3998, Route 2, Caroline County, issued June 17, 1939 to the Caroline County School Board, be cancelled as requested. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Rogers that under Section 5, Chapter 403, Acts of 1922, the following gentlemen be appointed traffic officers:

General J. A. Anderson, and Mr. Kenneth E. Gilpin. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Long, that the following Towns having passed ordinances turning over additional width of right of way on certain routes within these respective Towns, as provided by law, the Commission accept the same: Christiansburg, Onancock and Stuart. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Gilpin, that the request of Mr. H. C. Farmer, High Constable of Richmond, representing a large number of fishermen, for a platform to be built under the Pamunkey River Bridge at West Point as an experimental fishing place, the cost of which is to be borne by those interested, having been discussed and carefully considered by the Commission, the request be not granted, and the Commission reaffirm its former ruling. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilpin, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the Commission be authorized to look into the question of a proposed location of an access road to the Triton Chemical Corporation's property in Botetourt County. Motion carried.

The Commission considered the request of Honorable J. Howard Holleman for improvement to Routes 10 and 17 from Hopewell to Portsmouth, to encourage passenger traffic, and decided to make a survey, taking off the curves and flattening them out.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by General Anderson, that the Commission abide by the award made by the local commissioners in settling the condemnation proceedings regarding the location of Route 15 through the property of Mr. Lea Macdonald, Aldie, Virginia. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilpin, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that the following percentage factors for the distribution of Primary Construction Funds, being on area, primary road mileage, and population, according to the 1940 census, be adopted by the Commission:

Moved by General Anderson, seconded by Mr. Gilpin that the Commission add to the Primary System, under Chapter 288, Section 11-b, Acts of 1940, 4.7 miles of Route 856 in Nelson County, from the end of Primary Route 56, near Massie's Mill to Nash Post Office. Motion carried.

Moved by General Anderson, seconded by Mr. Long, that a survey be made on Route 94 near Fries. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by General Anderson, that the Commission proceed with rebuilding Route 80 through the Cavalier Hotel property at Virginia Beach, the Hotel people to furnish the right of way and the old location to revert to the Hotel property when the new section of road has been constructed and opened to traffic. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rawls, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that a permit be granted the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Company to construct a tunnel under the Blue Ridge Mountain just west of Hookfish Gap, crossing under State Route 250 over a strip of land fifty (50) feet in width, with such restrictions as the Commissioner deems advisable. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Rogers, seconded by Mr. Rawls, that a survey be authorized on Route 17, from Wheatland-South, a distance of approximately 4 miles. Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilpin, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that a survey be made from the Warren County Line via Double Toll Gate, White Post, Boyce, to Berryville, on Route 12 in Clarke County, Motion carried.

Moved by Mr. Gilpin, seconded by Mr. Rogers, that the Commission authorize a survey on Route 3 in Frederick County, from Winchester to Double Toll Gate. Motion carried.

The tentative allocations for 1942-1943 of \$15,000,000.00 available July 1, 1942 be as follows:

These tentative allocations have been made on the usual basis of trying to take care of the most pressing needs of the State Primary System.

The law provides that the Commission shall give preference to projects on which the right of way is donated. Should right of way difficulties prevent the prompt execution of any projects it is probable that the Commission will transfer the allocations to other projects for which the right of way can be secured.
