The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and Federal Highway Administration are conducting a feasibility study on how best to ease congestion and keep traffic moving during emergencies on I-66 westbound for the 6.5 miles from the Rosslyn tunnel to the Dulles Airport Access Road.

As requested by Governor Mark Warner, a community-based planning process will be used in considering a realistic, affordable, and effective transportation solution that stays within the existing right of way of I-66 westbound. This open and inclusive process will involve communities, businesses and other stakeholders. The study will begin with four initial concepts:

- A “No Build” option
- Transit options
- HOV/HOT Lane options
- Roadway widening options

Come and participate in one of two public workshops to help refine and prioritize the design concepts that could help reduce congestion on I-66 westbound.

Help determine how the proposed concepts should be evaluated and what measures should be used to select a concept. The two public workshops will be identical in format. You are encouraged to attend the workshop at the location most convenient for you.

Review the results of the October public workshops by attending the November 3rd open house.
