**Environmental Document Available for Review**

The Virginia Department of Transportation will construct a shared-use path from near Tysons One Place and Fashion Boulevard to Route 123 and Old Meadow Road via a new bicycle and pedestrian bridge over I-495 (Capital Beltway) in Tysons. This project aims to improve access and safety to pedestrian accommodations. It would be consistent with improving access to other transportation modes in the study corridor as identified in the Purpose and Need of the Final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Capital Beltway HOT Lanes. The bicycle and pedestrian bridge was not considered at the time of the Final EIS (2006), Record of Decision (2006), or subsequent re-evaluations (2007 and 2008).

**In compliance** with the provisions of 23 CFR 771.130(c), an Environmental Studies Memo (ESM) was prepared to assess the impacts of changes in the project and determine the significance of any new potential impacts since the approved environmental document in 2006. Pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act, Section 106 and 36 CFR 800, information concerning the potential effects of the proposed improvements on properties is also included in the ESM. The ESM is now available for public review and comment at the project website ([www.virginiadot.org/projects](http://www.virginiadot.org/projects)) or during business hours at VDOT's Northern Virginia District Office at 4975 Alliance Drive in Fairfax.
