

At its meeting on October 15, 2007 the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors approved a motion to endorse the VDOT design plans, as presented at the June 12, 2007 public hearing, to widen Stringfellow Road from Lee Jackson Memorial Highway (Rte.50) to Fair Lakes Boulevard (Rte. 7735) to four lanes. This would include two 12-foot inside travel lanes and two 14-foot outside travel lanes for on-road bicycle accommodations with curb and gutter, a 16-foot raised median, a 6-foot sidewalk on the west side and a 10-foot shared use path on the east side. The endorsement came with the following modification recommendations:

- Shift the road alignment to the east to minimize the impacts of the road widening on adjacent residential properties, and to better utilize existing right of way on the east side of Stringfellow Road
- Consider options to provide full access to school buses to Rocky Run Intermediate School from Stringfellow Road.
- Incorporate an interparcel service road to consolidate access to Greenbriar Park and the Greenbriar Community Center as requested by the Park Authority.
- Continue coordination with the Public library regarding access to Stringfellow Road.
- Evaluate options to minimize impacts to the Park properties with the proposed stormwater management ponds.
- Consider landscaping to minimize the visual impact of the road widening on adjacent properties.
- Reduce the design speed and use barrier curb to reduce impacts and improve safety

VDOT is currently developing the plans to comply with all the modifications requested by the County Board of Supervisors
