TEMPORARY SHIFTS AND POLICE-DIRECTED TRAFFIC CONTROL SCHEDULED TO BEGIN ALONG ROUTE 60 AS WORK ON SKIFFES CREEK CONNECTOR CONTINUES

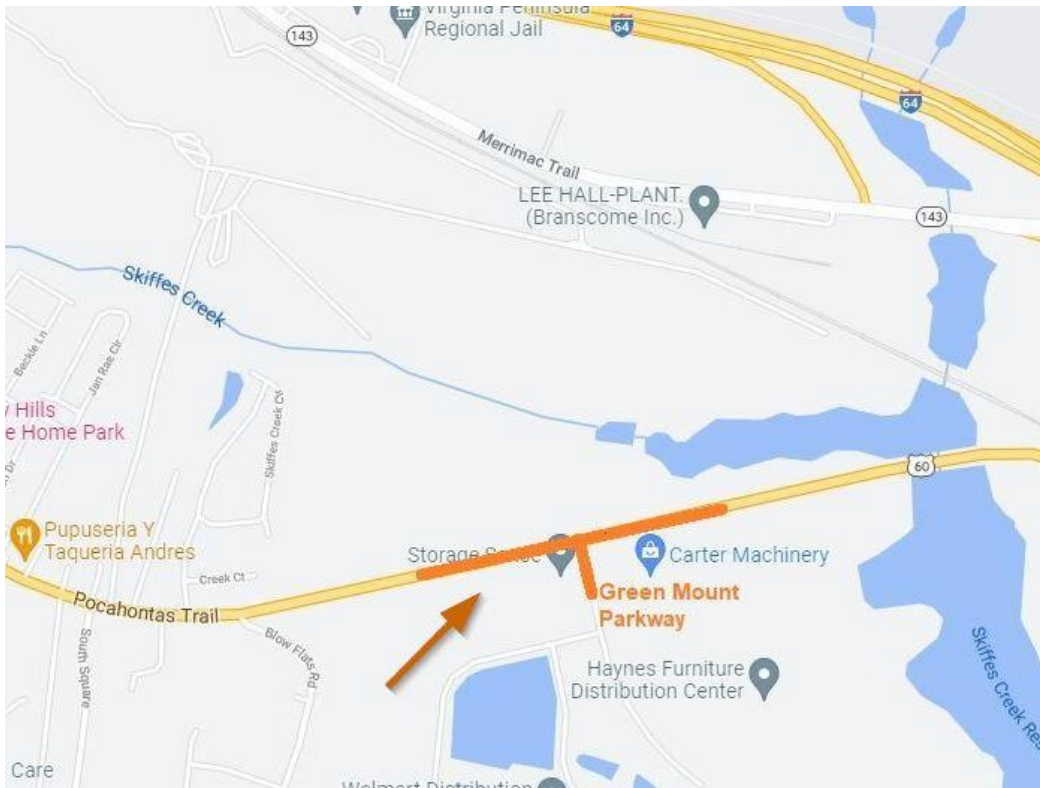
Construction crews to begin intersection improvements at Green Mount Parkway

JAMES CITY COUNTY – Starting as early as noon on Monday, Jan. 3, motorists traveling in both directions on Route 60 (Pocahontas Trail) between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. will be under police-directed traffic control with narrowed and shifted travel lanes at the intersection of Green Mount Parkway (Route 774).

Two-way traffic along Route 60 and turn access to and from Green Mount Parkway will be maintained during this work. The dedicated turn lanes from Route 60 onto Green Mount Parkway will close to accommodate the shifted traffic lanes; however, vehicles may turn directly from the through lane under police direction. Motorists are advised to drive with caution and obey all traffic signage and police signals within the construction zone.

These changes mark the start of the work to improve the intersection as part of the Skiffes Creek Connector project, including utility relocations, the installation of a new traffic signal, and creation of a multi-use path between Green Mount Parkway and the existing bus stop on Route 60.

Estimated to be complete as early as fall 2022, the Skiffes Creek Connector will improve local connectivity by providing a new, two-lane roadway between Route 60 and Route 143, in the area between Route 199 and Route 238, in a manner that improves safety, emergency evacuation, and the movement of goods along the two primary roadways.
