

Interstate 64 Improvements: Exit 205 to Exit 234 Henrico, New Kent, James City, and York Counties

Find out about a proposed widening of Interstate 64 (I-64) from four lanes to six lanes between Route 249/Bottoms Bridge (exit 205) and Route 199/Lightfoot (exit 234) in Henrico, New Kent, James City, and York counties.

The proposed project will consist of adding one 12-foot travel lane in each direction along I-64 east and west between mile marker 204.96 and mile marker 233.26. The proposed widening would take place in the median of I-64 within existing right-of-way.

This notice is limited to documentation for the environmental review under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and supporting technical documentation. Please note that no design information is available at this time. This notice is limited to the NEPA document and supporting information.

If a request for a public hearing is received, notice of date, time and place of the hearing will be posted.
